Please read these rules out to everyone taking part before you begin your safety brief

Archery Tag is a fun and energetic outdoor activity. By entering the activity, you acknowledge that there is a risk of injury and agree to give consent for you and/ or the children in your care to participate. To reduce the risks, you must ensure that you and anyone under your supervision follow these safety rules and any instructions given to you by Go Ape staff.

SUPERVISION

- One adult (18+) can supervise up to eight 10–15 year-olds. You can participate or supervise from the side of the battlefield but must remain in visual contact of anyone you are supervising for the duration of the activity.
- 16-year-olds and over are responsible for their own safety.

RULES

- Minimum age 10.
- Participants must not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- You must not smoke or vape whilst participating.
- All participants must wear a face mask and arm guard in the playing arena.
- All spectators must wear a face mask in the spectator zone.
- Always listen to your instructor and follow the instructions given to you, their decision is final.
- Arrows must only be shot at the opposing team from within the playing arena.
- If a horn is blown during a game, stop what you are doing immediately and await further instructions.
- Always look where you are going.
- Dangerous behaviour will result in the end of your session.

BEFORE YOU START

- Please alert an instructor if you or anyone you are supervising has a pre-existing injury or medical condition (including pregnancy) that could affect your ability to participate safely or may increase your risk of injury.
- Securely fasten your shoes, tie your hair up and remove loose jewellery.
- Waterproof phone pouches are available for £6 if you'd like to capture photos of your adventure.
- Our activities are fun and energetic. A gentle warm up and stretch will serve you well before you begin.
- Make sure you've all been to the toilet.
