GO CREATE... ADVENTURE STORIES

WHY USE TREETOP ADVENTURE TO DEVELOP PUPIL'S KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING OF ADVENTURE STORIES?

What better way to inspire your pupils than them becoming adventurers themselves? Ask your children to use their imaginations and put themselves in the role of someone on an epic adventure while up in the trees.

GO BITESIZE

• Read a selection of adventure stories where characters have to face natural problems or difficulties. Make comparisons between the different stories.

- Discuss how characters could overcome specific issues such as crossing a fast-flowing river, climbing a snow-covered mountain, crossing quicksand or trekking through a dense forest.
- Research well-known explorers read biographical accounts of some of the dangers / problems faced on explorations.
- Imagine a world where you can't touch the floor. What problems would that pose? Describe aspects of your day and explain how you would overcome these.
- On the day of your visit, imagine that the Treetop Adventure course is part of your journey. Map out your story.
- Did you face any difficulties whilst on the Treetop Adventure course? How did you cope with them? How did you feel when facing challenges?

GO PROJECT

Plan and write an adventure story where an explorer faces a natural disaster on their journey, but successfully reaches their goal.

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
